It is proposed to have a shared afternoon tea and the Club will provide tea, coffee and light refreshments.


Members are invited to bring along photos taken at past Riley events.

Earlier in the 60s the Canadian Hell Drivers (below) did the show circuit in their borrowed Holdens.


In the 70's the car of choice for the Dare Devils was the Chrysler Charger.


Some will go straight home on the highway. Some of us will take the leisurely route and accompany Helen and Ian Klose to Naracoorte and stay at Keith overnight.

Jetstar fly directly from Sydney and Melbourne to Busselton at very attractive rates and both Airport Rentals and Avis have cars available at the airport.



### Most Rileys don't have seat belts.

Most Rileys don't have seat belts. Some do. Some even have lap sash versions with the sash element suspended from the top of the b pillar. You know, that one from which the doors swing that's attached to the roof with a couple of rusty wood screws.

The consensus is that, while they might offer a false sense of security, and increase the number of persons who might choose to accompany you in your Riley, they offer little help in a crash and in some cases could do more harm that good.

And then there's the technical aspects of their being fitted in accordance with the legislation in various jurisdictions. I'm a features writer not a technical one so that research is well above my pay grade.


"In 1966, Holden was among the first car makers to fit seat belts as standard (at least for the driver and front passenger). Holden decided to prove the strength of the belts, so the PR-people arranged to suspend an HR Holden by one belt with a smaller Viva suspended by a second belt below the HR. In front of TV cameras, the crane driver holding both cars jerked a movement

which split the top-belt plate. The HR dropped onto the Viva, flattening it.

The story made the TV news and front pages of the papers across the country. The following day Holden repeated the exercise without a hitch, though nobody took much notice." \*\*
